

What is OSNI RegionalMap?

OSNI RegionalMap is a 1:250 000 scale digital vector topographic dataset covering Northern Ireland. Produced and maintained at source by Ordnance Survey of Northern Ireland, it forms part of EuroRegionalMap – a seamless harmonised dataset currently covering 7 European countries. The full EuroRegionalMap product is a Pan-European vector database designed as a topographical framework and as a base product for multi-purpose GIS at the scale of 1:250 000.

Key Features

Currently covering Belgium, France, Denmark, Germany, Luxembourg, Northern Ireland and Ireland, it is being extended to include 25 countries.

Compiled by the National Mapping and Cadastral Agencies of each country, creating the most reliable official data at this scale.

The database will be constantly updated and linked with the national databases.

Administrative boundaries, Water network, Settlements, Transport network, Miscellaneous objects, Soil and vegetation and Named locations
- ◆ Compliant with proposed INSPIRE (Infrastructure for Spatial Information in Europe) directive
- ◆ All data is fully attributed using the DIGEST (NATO Standardisation Agreement) feature catalogue
- ◆ Metadata compliant with ISO 19115
- ◆ Features can be linked to any database
